

SHEFFIELD'S NEW CITY LANDING PAD

Late last year, a new space opened in one of the unoccupied offices in the Heart of the City development. The City Landing Pad is used to support a city-wide approach to attracting investment and fostering business and public sector partnerships. With a flexible set-up, the City Landing Pad can be moved to new locations around the city as and when required.

City Landing Pad is a partnership between Sheffield Property Association, Sheffield Chamber, Sheffield BID, Sheffield Technology Parks, and Sheffield City Council. The partnership aims to showcase Sheffield's strengths to investors, by convening investment-critical partners and speaking with 'one voice' from a statement space within the Heart of the City development.



READ ALL ABOUT IT: Sheffield Digital Roundtable



The Sheffield Digital Policy Roundtable series was launched in response to a growing need for our city's digital community to have a stronger voice in national, regional and local policy discussions, and for contemporary policy debates to be better understood by local firms and our partner organisations. The first Roundtable was held here at Electric Works in 2025 with latter events hosted at Sheffield Technology Parks and most recently at the Innovation Centre.

The latest Policy Roundtable revealed a region at a pivotal moment. With local innovation clusters embedded into statutory planning and venture capital investment hitting a record high, there is evidence that the ecosystem is visibly maturing. However, Sheffield Digital believe that this ambition must now be matched by infrastructure – both physical and relational in order to realise it.


